Nation's Top Business Schools Tapping Veterans for MBA Program

The nation's top business schools are recruiting more an more recently discharged service personnel to join banks and engineers who are earning a master's in business administration. Various business school deans told the *Wall Street* Journal that veterans bring something to the room that other students don't: They have been responsible for lives, bringing gravitas to class room discussions, and they automatically know how to work in a team.

Recipe of the Month Hearty Vegetable Beef Soup



A hearty beef and vegetable soup is hard to beat--especially if it's homemade. This recipe is easy to follow and results in a tasty dish you can be proud of. This recipe was provide by Betty Courtney for one our dinners. It is one her families favorites. It is even more fantastic warmed up and served the next day. Don't forget the French or Italian bread.

Ingredients

- 5 pounds beef tri tip loin roast or stew meat
- 5 pkg. dry onion soup mix
- 4 cups sliced celery (18 stalks)
- 2 cups chopped onion (3 medium size)
- 8 cups sliced carrots (18 medium carrots)
- 1 (7 pound) can stewed tomatoes
- 2 (29 ounce) cans tomato sauce
- 2 pounds frozen corn
- 1 pound frozen lima beans
- 2 pounds frozen peas
- 2 pounds frozen green beans
- Salt and pepper to taste

Preparation

- 1. In a 16-quart stockpot add bite size pieces of tri tip loin, celery and onions, onion soup mix, and enough water to cover. Bring to boil, cover, reduce heat and simmer for about 1 to 1-1/2 hours..
- 2. Add more water and diced carrots, stewed tomatoes and tomato sauce. Bring back to boil and cook for about 1 hour.
- 3. Add more water and potatoes. Continue cooking until potatoes are cooked. About this time I usually start add-ing salt & pepper and the garlic.
- 4. Add frozen corn, peas and green beans. Add more water if needed. Reduce the heat, and simmer, uncovered, 30 minutes or until tender. Add more salt, pepper and water if needed. If you like a thicker soup add 1/4 cup of instant mashed potatoes (a little at a time) to thicken the soup mixture. Continue cooking while getting the thickness you desire.

Serve with a Garden salad (Tomatoes, Cucumbers, Radishes, Bell Peppers and red Onion) and French or Italian bread for a hearty meal.

Makes approximately 30 servings at 1-1/2 cups per serving.
